## Presiding Bishop's Christmas Message



*For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Isaiah 9:6*

Isaiah pronounces these words to a people who remember the yoke of slavery laid on their shoulders. They've been waiting for this child, whose birth transforms that yoke into a mantle of authority. They are promised that this authority will continue to grow as the peaceable commonwealth is established – with justice and righteousness for all, and for ever.

This promise is spoken anew to people in every age, to those who have lived under oppression or in dark depression, to the hungry and ill and imprisoned. The birth we celebrate offers hope, in Word made flesh, who comes among us to heal and walk this way with us. The mantle of authority on his shoulders begins in the swaddling clothes of a child born in the humblest of circumstances. Yet that authority is recognized even by foreigners from far away. That mantle of authority does continue to grow, through a life offered for others, raised into new life, and passed on to new generations of fleshly

God-bearers. Wherever justice and righteousness is done, that authority is growing, borne on the shoulders of the Prince of Peace.

He comes again, bearing the grace of the One whose image he wears in flesh. Seek him, sing his new song, declare his glory, and tell out the good news to all the nations: God reigns, and he is coming bearing righteousness and truth on his shoulders.

May you discover that humble authority born again on the edges of the world's notice. May that royal inheritance and authority of the stable be born in you, enliven your heart, and rest on your shoulders. Bear it abroad in peace, this year and throughout the ages.

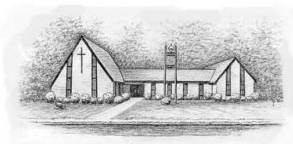

# Deacon's Corner

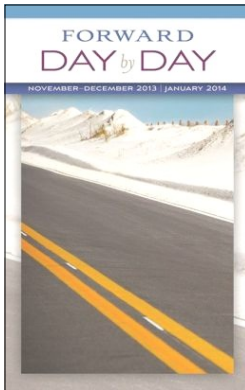


2014, a new year with new resolutions: lose weight, exercise more, turn off the TV and read more. Make my body and mind better. What though about our souls?

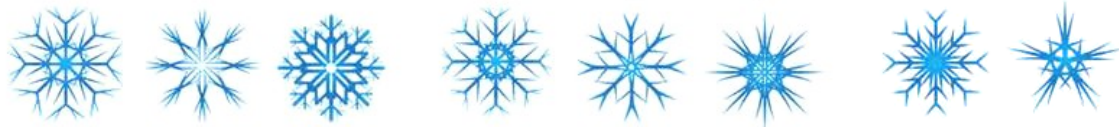

### Epiphany Service Sunday, January 5 at 5:00 pm

Once again this year we'll celebrate the coming of the magi with the other Episcopal Churches in our convocation. We'll all gather at:

Church of the Epiphany

We'll remember the many ways God is revealed to us in readings and songs of celebration. Then we'll share the Eucharist together. Come celebrate the season together and help fill Church of the Epiphany for their patronal feast.

### Men's Choir Sunday, January 12 at 10:15

The men did such an amazing job with the anthem in December that we're going to try it again. All the men of the church are invited to join in singing "We Three Kings" (hymn 128) during the 10:30 service on the first Sunday after the Epiphany, January 12. Most will find the hymn quite familiar, so our only practice will be at 10:15 on that day. Come make a joyful noise!

### Worship in Epiphany



The season of Epiphany is when we remember the many ways God is revealed to us. The overarching symbol is the star that lit the sky over Bethlehem, pointing to the newborn Lord. You'll notice star imagery throughout our services this season.

We'll use Eucharistic Prayer C, with its reference to "the vast expanse of interstellar space." And our offertory sentence will be Isaiah 60:1, "Arise, shine; for your light has

come, and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you."

In Epiphany we talk about Jesus as the Light of the World. Light is what dispels the darkness of sin and ignorance with hope and grace. These themes are summed up perfectly in our Song of Praise for the season, Hymn 7, a Charles Wesley classic.



Christ, whose glory fills the skies,  
Christ, the true, the only Light,  
Sun of Righteousness, arise,  
Triumph o'er the shades of night;  
Dayspring from on high, be near;  
Day-star, in my heart appear.

Dark and cheerless is the morn  
Unaccompanied by Thee;  
Joyless is the day's return  
Till Thy mercy's beams I see;  
Till they inward light impart,  
Glad my eyes, and warm my heart.

Visit then this soul of mine,  
Pierce the gloom of sin and grief;  
Fill me, Radiance divine,  
Scatter all my unbelief;  
More and more Thyself display,  
Shining to the perfect day.

This Epiphany may we all be filled with the light of Christ's love - and may we shine that light onto all we meet.
